We serve children 6 weeks – 5 years old. We have Head Start programs in Clark, Montgomery, and Madison counties. To be eligible, families must earn 100% of the Federal Poverty Level or less. We offer full-day (8-10 hours) and part-day (3.5 hours). There is also a 6-hour/day option. If you are not ready to send your child to a center, we have a home visiting program. Transportation is provided at some locations. Children in full-time early learning and childcare may need to pay a minimal co-pay.

The items required to start enrollment: child's proof of birth, proof of household income, child's shot record. We give priority enrollment for children/families receiving SNAP/SSI/TANF in Foster Care, Kinship Care or families that are experiencing Homelessness.

Early Head Start – In partnership with Miami Valley Child Development Centers, Inc, the SCSD staff provides a weekly home-visiting program called Early Head Start using the Parents As Teachers curriculum to 77 eligible children in Clark County. Income eligible pregnant women and children 0-5 years of age are eligible to participate.

Project Springboard – A comprehensive family literacy program serving the most educationally and economically disadvantaged residents of Clark County. Adults who want to earn a high school credential who have children, ages 0-5 years of age are eligible to participate. Program operates Mon-Thursday, 9 am. – noon at the Clark Center. Child care and transportation support is provided.

ASPIRE- to help adults increase reading, math, writing, speaking and listening skills in order to: earn a high school credential, prepare for work and post-secondary education and partner in the education of their children. Daytime and evening classes are offered at the School of Innovation free of charge.

Adult ESOL- To provide English language instruction to adult learners as they develop their social use of the language. The course aims to prepare adult learners to use English for entering career and technical or other postsecondary education and employment. The target audience is parents of Springfield City School students.

McKinney-Vento – Providing support to students of SCSD who lack fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence to ensure they have equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including preschool, as other children and youth.
